Museum Passes

Summer is, of course, the prime season for New Bedford residents to use our museum passes. While you may try to pick up a pass on the day you want to go, most of them have been reserved in advance. Thus, planning is always the best way to ensure you have a pass when you need it. You can do this either in person, by telephone, or online through our Web site: www.newbedfordlibrary.org.

All library locations have the Buttonwood Park Zoo passes; the other museum passes are only at the Main Library. The passes can only be taken out on adult library cards.

During the summer the Library has passes to the following:

- **Buttonwood Park Zoo** – admits 4 people for free.
- **Children's Museum**, Boston – admits 4 people at the half the current admission fee.
- **JFK Museum and Library** – admits 2 adults, seniors or students for \$3 each. Children under 12 are free.
- **Museum of Science**, Boston – admits 4 people at the reduced rate of \$7.00 per person, but does not include the Omni Theatre or the Planetarium.
- **Museum of Fine Arts** – admits 2 people at \$7.00 per person for general admission or \$13.00 per person for exhibit tickets.
- **New Bedford Whaling Museum** – admits 2 adults and two children at the half the current admission fee.
- **Ocean Explorium** – admits up to 8 people for free.
- **Plimoth Plantation** – admits 2 adults for \$12.00 a piece and 2 children for \$8.00 a piece.

If a pass needs to be returned, please do it the next day. Someone is likely to be waiting for it. The fine is \$5.00 per day.

The replacement fee for a lost pass is \$25.00. Therefore, please be careful. The Library would much rather have the pass than the fine!
