Minutes of 10/21/13 Meeting

Present: *Fernando Giraldo, Co-Owner along with Martha Gonzalez, Co-Owner/Manager*

Ms. Gonzalez opened the hearing by submitting a letter to the Board explaining as to why their previously stated ‘August’ opening has been delayed, which the Board voted unanimously to receive and place on file.

Responding to questions from Chairman Beauregard, after explaining what they had done already and what still needs to be done, Ms. Gonzalez stated that she didn’t think the work would be completed until the end of January, and that she didn’t think it would be realistic to expect an opening before February 2014.

Chairman Beauregard suggested that they approve the 2014 renewal and tabled the matter until the Board’s February meeting in order to give the licensees an opportunity to complete the work, and strongly suggested to Ms. Gonzalez that the work be completed by that meeting, and warned that their failure to do so could affect the status of their license.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to follow the recommendation to approve the 2014 renewal and to table the matter to the Board’s February 2014 meeting. – **Unanimous**

Present: *Fernando Giraldo, Co-Owner along with Charlie McGregor, Contractor*

When asked by Chairman Beauregard to give the Board an update regarding the ongoing renovations, Mr. Giraldo stated that the renovations were going really good, and that over the past few days they’ve had an electrical inspection ... a gas inspection ... but they were still on the Fire, Health, and Building inspections ... all the construction is done ... were just waiting for approvals and permits.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if they had anticipated opening date at this point, Mr. Giraldo responded, not really ... as you know these things take time coordinating ... it something we can’t control ... it everything goes smooth ... hopefully we can open within a month I hope ...everything should be all set.

Mr. Nanopoulos recommended to the Board that the matter should be tabled to the Board’s May meeting, which would give Mr. Giraldo almost three months to finish the project and open up, which should be ample time based on the information he provided at this meeting.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to follow the recommendation to table the matter to the Board's May meeting, with the stipulation, if the premise is operational by that date then there would be no need for Mr. Giraldo to appear at the May meeting. – **Unanimous**

Note: On a recommendation by Mr. Nanopoulos from Mr. Nanopoulos, the Board took up the rest of the 'agenda' as it awaited the arrival of Atty. Bailey, who had a earlier meeting he had to attend.

The City of New Bedford Treasurer/Collector of Taxes has requested that the Licensing Board hold a hearing for revocation of your MV Class II license due to non-payment of personal property taxes, based on your neglect or refusal to pay your local property tax to the City of New Bedford by January 1, 2014, as previously notified. All Licensees must be in compliance for renewals of all Class II licenses.

Please be advised that your presence is required at a hearing to determine whether you have violated certain provisions of City of New Bedford Ordinance Sec.10 – 45 with regard to outstanding personal property tax owed to the City of New Bedford.

Please be advised that you are currently in violation of operating a used car lot without a license.

Failure to appear at this hearing will result in the immediate revocation of your license by this Board.

Minutes of 02/25/13 Hearing

Present: *Ronald Moura, Licensee; Atty. Blair Bailey, Asst. City Solicitor (Tax Title)*

Mr. Moura submitted documentation that showed that he did not owe any personal property tax, and added that the property that the business is on (which is in tax title) is under Antone Moura and that his name is Ronald Moura, and that his father was the owner of the property for 67 years until his death a few years ago; and that he's the only survivor outside of his son, and that he's in the process of getting everything transferred over; and that he planned to go to the Treasurer's Office to put some money down to continue his payment plan.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard when his father passed away, Mr. Moura stated that he passed away in 2008 but there have been some complications in getting the property transferred; and that he was told by Mr. Nanopoulos a few years ago that he had to apply for a Class II license under his own name, and that he couldn't operate the business under his deceased father's name, so he changed the business into his name.

Atty. Bailey then reviewed his payment history on the property, which showed that there had not been any payments made on the real property taxes since August of 2012.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if he was prepared to make a payment, Mr. Moura responded, "yes".

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to the payment amount he was prepared to make, Mr. Moura responded, when I go down to find out how much she needs, I'll give it to her.

Atty. Bailey estimated that it would take a payment of roughly \$6,000.00 in order for the city to enter into a payment plan with Mr. Moura on the balance of the Tax Title amount, which would include being current on the first three quarters of his 2013 taxes, as well as the required down payment on his Tax Title amount; Atty. Bailey also informed Mr. Moura that his old payment plan was no longer valid due to changes approved by the City Council, and that he had to enter into a new payment plan.

Mr. Moura agreed to the \$6,000.00 estimate and stated that he would be in tomorrow to see Peggy in the Treasurer's Office to make a payment, and set up a payment plan on the balance, to which Atty. Bailey approved; with the suggestion that the Board table the matter to its next meeting to ensure that what was agreed to was carried out by Mr. Moura.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to table the matter until the Board's March 27, 2013 meeting, with no further action to be taken, if the agreed amount is paid and a signed agreement on the balance is signed by Mr. Moura. – **Unanimous**

Note: **Mr. Moura made one lump sum payment on his 2013 Tax Bill in March of 2013 to become current on his 2013 taxes but never made another payment on his 2013 taxes, (the balance was rolled over into Tax Title), but he never entered and signed a 'new' Tax Title Re-Payment Agreement as required by the Board's decision; and only made one Tax Title payment of \$316.76 on 12/30/13.**

Mr. Moura has neither contacted this office nor the Treasurer's Offices since he attempted to renew his Class II Dealer license in December, at which time he was instructed to contact the City Treasurer to resolve his Tax Title issues and come back to renew his license. He is currently operating with an expired license.

Present: Ronald Moura, Licensee; Atty. Blair Bailey, Asst. City Solicitor (Tax Title)

Chairman Beauregard opened the hearing by first recognizing Atty. Bailey for an update of the current status of Mr. Moura's tax title issues.

Atty. Bailey stated, as we do every year ... I had a conversation with Nick on various individuals ... who are repeat offenders on these kind of things ... Nick and I share a little of a frustration level on these issues, as I know the Chair does as well as the Board ... given Mr. Moura's situation ... and the fact that he did make a pretty good effort last year to getting up to date with us ... I think he made two payments I believe on the payment plan ... he's trying to resolve his father's estate as to the property ... I talked to the Treasurer ... and the Treasurer is willing to give him one more shot ... however, he needs to come up with approximately \$5,000.00 that would pay him up to date this year for the first three quarters of fiscal year '14' ... and 25% of the current tax title amount ... and the remainder would be in a payment plan over 4 or 5 years ... I explained to Mr. Moura and emphasized that the payment plans require not only the monthly payments ... but you have to stay current ... you cannot wait to pay the ongoing year ... that's why he has to pay the money that's already due (3 quarters) ... I'm not entirely convinced that we were not going to be back here having the same conversation that we've had with multiple people ... he's always been good to work with and talk to ... and he's always come up with the money when we've asked for it ... and the Treasurer has expressed her willingness to give him this one last shot with a payment plan one more time ... I'm not going to call her on it ... but I hope he understands where we are with this.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard, what are your plans, Mr. Moura responded, my plan is to give her the money that she needs, and then she's going to tell me how much she wants per month by the 15th of next month (March); at which point I'll come in and renew my license, that's all I can do.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard if he will have the funds to pay whatever amount is required, Mr. Moura responded, I'll have it on the first of the month ... that's when the money comes in ... and that's why I have to wait until the 15th to make the payment.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard, and from that point you'll stay current, Mr. Moura responded, yes, and explained that he had a problem this year because he was hospitalized for a period of time.

Atty. Bailey responded to Mr. Moura's health issues by stating, if you have any health problems or any other type of problems that would prevent you from complying with our agreement, you need to call us.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to table the matter until the Board's March 24, 2014 meeting, with no further action to be taken, if the agreed amount is paid and a signed agreement on the balance is signed by Mr. Moura. – **Unanimous**
